Introduction - How does the book begin?

Point of View - This book is an autobiography. Explain the benefits of this story being told from Anne Frank's point of view. How might this story be different if someone else wrote it.

Rising Action - How did the members of the Annexe influence Anne's development. How did Anne's friendship with Peter affect her growth as an individual? Describe some of the things that the two did together.

Discovery - What are some of the things that Anne Frank discovers about herself and about others throughout the story? Describe how she discovers love.

Climax - What are some of the highlights of Anne Frank's story? What events make a major impact on her life? At what point do you think she reached maturity, if any?

Resolution - Explain the obstacles that Anne Frank ultimately overcame and how she went about overcoming them. What does her perseverance reveal about her character and how did her life change? What ultimately happened to Anne Frank and her family?

What did you like best about this book? What did you like the least?

What else would you have liked for Anne Frank to have included or expanded upon in her diary?
