Obedience without knowledge is a form of blindness. What does Annie think might happen to Helen if she only knew to obey and nothing else? Use content from the play to support your answer.

What is Annie's philosophy of teaching? Use her letters as a guide to determining your response.

Symbol - A symbol is a thing that represents something else. The pump is used as a symbol in the play. Using events from the play as support, explain how the pump is symbolic.
